

## Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society is Looking for YOU!



- 39% of students at 2- and 4-year colleges had experienced food insecurity in the last 30 days
- 35% of students said their hunger had impacted their ability to study.
- More than 1/3 of students knew someone who had dropped out of school due to their ability to afford food
