

Professor Frawley Presented at Higher Education Conference

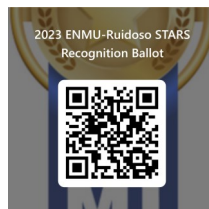
Jeff Frawley, professor of English and department chair of Language, Humanities and Fine Arts recently presented at the New Mexico Higher Education Assessment and Retention Conference Feb. 17 in Albuquerque. The title was "Using a Student-Run Creative Publication for Assessment and Rural Community Building at a Two-Year Campus." His presentation explained how scholarship in creative writing studies is impacting the study of retention in writing courses, and how the College's literary magazine, *Ridgeline Review*, is being used to impact retention and assessment in general education writing courses, while also building a sense of community around the arts in our rural region.
