## ENMU-Ruidoso Receives Beautification Award

Friday, June 9 ENMU-Ruidoso was recognized with the Ruidoso Valley Chamber of Commerce's 2023 Beautification Award. Since 2019 ENMU-Ruidoso has renovated over 35,000 square feet of interior space and the exterior of the campus at 709 Mechem Drive. The purpose of the renovations built an inviting campus that is functional for the workforce, students, and community use. Beginning with Nexus Phase 1 in fall 2019, followed by Nexus Phase 2 in spring 2021, and concluding with Nexus Phase 3 finishing in fall of 2022 construction included a new learning commons, workforce classrooms, traditional classrooms, study spaces, seminar rooms, a large lecture space, food area, parking lot improvements, retaining wall improvements, and a patio. Funding for the total project came from a variety of sources including local funds and state funds.
