



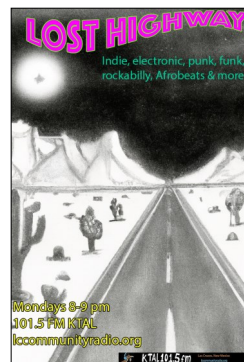
ENMU-Ruidoso Receives RCCA Community Engagement Award

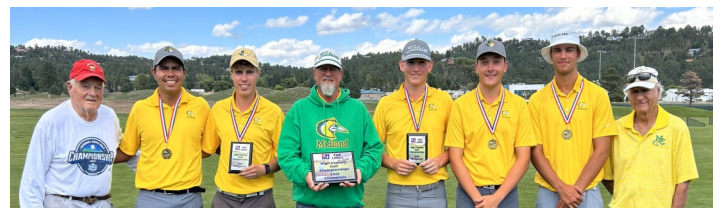
Tularosa Basin Downwinders Consortium Presentation Wednesday
