ENMU-Ruidoso recently became a member of the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association (NIRA), the sanctioning body for Intercollegiate Rodeo Competitions. ENMU-Ruidoso is one of 137 member colleges and universities in the U.S. NIRA sanctions




more than 100 college rodeos a year throughout 11 regions in the U.S. and has over 3,500 college student athlete members. Nine rodeo events are offered to contestants at the college rodeos. The women can enter and compete in barrel racing, breakaway roping, goat tying, and team roping. The men's events are saddle bronc riding, bareback riding, bull riding, tiedown roping, steer wrestling, and team roping. All-around titles are given to contestants who compete in multiple events. At the end of the spring season, the top three contestants in the regional standings in each event earn their spot at the College National Finals Rodeo (CNFR) in Casper, Wyo. Read more.
