### Summer Youth Boxing Class Offered June 10-Aug. 8

The youth boxing class will be Mondays and Wednesdays, 5-6 p.m. in the ENMU-Ruidoso Annex. Cost is \$140 plus \$15 fees which include a mouth guard, hand wraps and foul protection. The youth boxing class is designed for the student who is committed to understanding the principles of boxing technique and fitness. The class will include consistent work on fundamental boxing skills: range, structure, defensive, offensive skills, using feints, counters, sparring, slipping, bobbing and weaving. The class will focus on developing skills and strategies around boxing at a high level. Students will gain fundamental knowledge of boxing, including increased fitness and skills to successfully and safely navigate the boxing environment. Experienced students will build off existing knowledge to become a more confident and skilled boxer.
