Dr. Joanie King is a NMSU assistant professor and Extension entomologist. She earned a doctorate degree in entomology from Texas A&M University, a master's degree of science in entomology from the University of Georgia, and a bachelor's degree of science in biology from the University of Central Florida. Alongside her Extension and outreach focus, Dr. King's lab focuses on host-parasite interactions, community ecology, and integrated pest management (IPM). In addition to serving the NMSU community through Extension and research, she is active in the Entomological Society of America. Sharing bug science is cool!
